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WOW! If two are DC's they don't have a local Admin Password, it would be a Domain Admin password. Neither Admins account will affect the cluster. So change away. You should be aware that all nodes should look exactly alike and that clustering a DC is NEVER a good idea. See <http://support.microsoft.com/kb/281662> for details. You really need to fix your cluster.
