>>>> Private IP ... so instead of exposing it's private IP I
>>>> removed that from DNS.

>>> It still applies, Win2k3 and XP will try to register the PTR records for the
>>> IPs on their interfaces. If the reverse zone for the private address does
>>> not exist, it will try to register it in the authoritative DNS server for
>>> the reverse lookup. In this case prisoner.iana.org. If you create the
>>> reverse zone, the error will stop.
>>> I believe on non DCs you can deselect "register this connections addresses
>>> in DNS" and it will stop the DNS client from registering its addresses. DCs
>>> require registry entries.
