>> short, just to experiment, I removed the zone, and it still worked.

>> Let me know if you want the long story version of it. Anyway, I sure
>> will need your helps again if I ever had to deal with the zones or
>> trusts or sharing resources in LAN.

> You'll need to recreate the zone, the only reason it still worked
> after you deleted the zone is that the record was cached in the DNS
> client cache. Once the record expires, so will the site.
> Adding the host header made it so you could have multiple websites on
> the same IP address, you'll likely need that to keep from having to
> add a bunch of IP address to the NIC.

Oh there is one more thing, Exchange does not like host headers in the
default website. Host headers on the default website will cause an error
connecting to the Public folders in Exchange.
