There has to be other people out there that have IIS 6.0 and are using a CNAME record???

Sure, I do it. It works.

You have something wrong in the Site definition, the default file name or settings, the permissions on the actual files (NTFS), or the AUTHENTICATION methods (unlikely since you get a blank screen but I put this in for completeness since it is another common problem -- easily created and easily solved.)

still looking for a fix here... everything i have tried takes the site out.
