But i made a blunder and name tha Domain the same as our web site, now i can not enter the web site from any machine that join the Domain. I really do not want to go thru the process of renaming the domain. Im new at DNS i need help. Thanks

You can access the web site by it's full name, e.g.,
www.yourDomain.com

You will not be able to access it by the "domain name only", e.g., yourDomain.com since all DC register this name as well.

If you cannot do the first, then likely you haven't YET added a record for www.yourDomain.com to your INTERNAL DNS.

When running a Shadow DNS (external and internal versions of your DNS, aka Split DNS) you must enter
