> Server 2003 domain from a client XP workstation. Both the server and the
> workstation are new machines with the latest processors and plenty of
memory.
> When I initially join the new domain by changing from the old domain to

> new one in "My Computer" properties (and re-boot as required), it takes
> around 10 minutes to login for the first time. After the first login, I
> would expect it to be much faster, but it still takes around four minutes
to
> login each time I logout. Does anyone have any ideas on why this is so
slow?
