I hope I understood correctly, I logged on to another server and added the bad machine. But based on the permissions I saw, it appears I was actually looking at local permissions, not permissions from the remote bad server. The reason I think they were the local permissions was because IIS from that local server was listed under launch.

Anyway, the permissions were correct as you had listed.

Did I miss something?

- > able to modify them locally due to the dcomcnfg utility failing to open the
- > properties of "My Computer". To order to resolve the issue, I would like to
- > suggest you attempt to perform the following steps:

- > 1. On another Windows 2003 server open the dcomcnfg utility.
- >
- > 2. Expand "Component Services" and then "Computers".
- >
- > 3. Right click on "Computers" and select "New" then "Computer".
- >
- > 4. In the "Browse" box type in the name of the computer to be modified and
- > click "OK".
- >
- > 5. Click on the "COM Security tab.
- >
- > 6. In the "Access Permissions" click the "Edit Default..." button and add

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- > or remove entries until you have only:
- >
- > SELF with Allow Local Access and Remote Access.
- > SYSTEM with Allow Local Access only.
- >
- > 7. In the "Launch and Activation Permissions" click "Edit Default..." and
- > add or remove entries until you have only:
- >
- > ADMINISTRATORS (Local System\Administrators) with Allow: Local Launch,
- > Remote Launch, Local Activation and Remote Activation.
- > INTERACTIVE with Allow: Local Launch, Remote Launch, Local Activation and
- > Remote Activation
- > SYSTEM with Allow: Local Launch, Remote Launch, Local Activation and
- > Remote Activation.
- >
- > Note: There may be some specialized third party applications that require
- > an account be included but there should never be any unknown accounts or
- > SIDs included.
- >
- > 8. Click "OK" until you have exited the dcomcnfg utility.
- >
- > And then reboot the windows 2003 server.
- >
