Also if you are just looking to use Server for hosting a website and you are looking to use IIS for this function you can save money by purchasing the Web Edition of Server 2003. EULA of Web Server edition does not allow programs like Apache to work, you would need a full version.

BUT... in that case, if ALL your looking for is a Web Server you can do this on XP as well... lots of options here. I would google "Windows Web Server" for some reads.
