Maybe the directory is in fact empty, the data may have been deleted by accident, sounds like you need to check backups or Shadow copies if enabled.

if you remember a file name that should be in the directory, try searching for it. I have seen people move a directory into another by accident but not files though.

If you are sure the folder has not been tampered with or the contents accidentally deleted then this could be a problem with your storage system / hard drive.
