i'm charged with maintaining an application which has multiple listener services.

the first service can be set to auto.

subsequent services need to be passed a parameter to start.

in 2003 i've used sc.exe to pass a parameter to a service on startup and this works fine. i could set it so that the services were started by the act of logging in.

however, i'd like the services to come up automatically on restart without the need for user intervention, since that's what services are supposed to do.

my question is, therefore, the one in the title:

how can i start a service in windows server 2003 on machine restart and pass it a parameter?
