Thanks for your posting here.

There is no 1B record in your cache. Please recreate an LMHOSTS file on the DC and point to the PDC in the source domain. For your convenience, I have included the following articles.

Do you have DNS for your WINNT domain? If so, I recommend that you point your NT PDC to NT DNS and create a secondary zone on Windows 2003 DNS for the NT DNS.
