>I am migrating about 300 Windows NT 4.0 domains into one Active Directory > domain. I am also migrating file and print in the process. I have > developed > a way of reading the ACLs on the existing NT 4.0 servers and re-applying > them > on the new Windows 2003 servers. Unfortunately after using the XCACLS > utility > to re-apply the rights, I get the following warning when I try to read > permissions on a file or a folder:  
> > "The permissions on FolderName are incorrectly ordered, which may cause > some > entries to be ineffective. Press OK to continue and sort the permissions > correctly, or Cancel to reset the permissions"  
> > Everything seems to work correctly after pressing OK to this message. > Obviously it would be completely impossible for me to do that for all > files > and folders.  
> > I have found a hotfix (KB article ID#834721) for CACLS but that one is for > Windows 2000. Also, I need to use XCACLS as I believe CACLS does not > support > the /Y switch. Has anybody seen this? Any help would be greatly > appreciated. > Thank you in advance for taking the time to look into it.
