1. Both dom1 and dom2 will be the child domain for maxis.com.my so what is the best migration path for this kind of setup? Any guide available

— You may create two child domains in Windows 2k/2k3. Then you can use ADMT to migrate the original two Windows NT to the two child domain separately.

2. Is it possible to move all my users and nt/2000 server and nt/xp workstation to our new child domain. I still will want my nt server be available in both child domain. Is there any guide available?

Yes, you can also use ADMT migrate the users and computers account to the new child domain. However, the NT PDC cannot be available in this scenario.
