Question 1:

Because I can only create a new domain named location1.companyname.com, will this allow me to connect to the other site as a member of companyname.com domain?? If not, how can this be accomplished???

No, this will not allow to connect to the other site as a member of companyname.com domain. You may create a new Windows 2003 server and join it as a child domain controller. Then you can use ADMT migrate the AD objects from location1.com to location1.companyname.com.

| During the in-place upgrade, when I am installing Active Directory it
seems
| that the only working option is to "Create a New Domain in a New
Forest." If
| I try and choose either of the other options such as "create a new
child
| domain in a existing domain tree" or "create a new domain tree in an
existing
| domain forest," the process fails because the parent domain obviously
cannot
| be contacted. Therefore, I am only able to "create a new domain in a
new
| forest."
