> *We've lost a T1 connection between two of our offices, and*
> *it looks like it may be down for at least a week. We have*
> *Internet connectivity at each location through different*
> *ISP's. Since we are small we are bridging traffic rather*
> *than routing. Can we use Windows Routing and Remote*
> *Access service to build a VPN between the locations?*

Yes, but it will be routed.

> *Would I have to move one location to a different subnet (I*
> *don't want to do this)? Any other suggestions?*

Yes. Always configure them in separate ranges so that you only have to change the subnet mask.

For instance, if you use 1-126 for one location and 129-254 for the other then you can always alter the mask, but this won't help you now.

It's sort of silly to bridge a T1 anyway when routers are so cheap so maybe this is a good time to reconfigure.
