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As long as your computer is a member of the domain, computer configuration policy will always apply to it and user configuration will always apply to you when you logon to the domain either live or with cached credentials. The "shutdown event tracker" is part of computer configuration. I do NOT recommend that you remove the computer from the domain as you may not be able to logon unless you know and name/password for a local user account and if you remove a computer from the domain while it is not connected the domain, your domain Group Policy settings may not be "unapplied" correctly anyhow. --- Steve
