Ok, I have now looked through my Group Policies as well as running searches on several computers registries and do not find any settings that would force Net time to refer to a particular computer. All the information I have read indicates that by default Net Time uses the PDC. But on all computers including the PDC in my network when I type Net Time it gives me the time and refers to a different DC (it may have been the PDC at one time but is not now). How do I fix this?
