- 2.) See if Appletalk is still set to accept inbound connections on the correct adapter.
- 3.) Try connecting from a Mac using afp://serverIP
- 4.) Try connecting via Appletalk if you support it – afp://at/servername.
- 5.) Try connection from a Mac using smb://serverIP

Can you connect from a PC using the same accounts that are denied connections on a Mac client?
