(From an computer in the domain I can use the shared folder) The network connection to the server is all right (tried with ping). So I used the command net use X: \\ip\resource

But now the network resource can not be found....

What's could be a cause for that error?

More than likely it's either a permissions or SMB signing issue. I assume you pinged with the computer's NetBIOS name? When you pinged, did it resolve to the FQDN and gave you a reply or did it just give a reply?

When using a net use command to this resource, you'll need to supply credentials too.

```
net use x: \\computerName\shareName /user:domainName\username  
/persistent:yes
```

Did you also try it using Map Drive from Explorer and supply alternate credentials in the form of domainName\username and the password?
