(I thought I read that just logging off and back on would trigger the reinstall, but it has not worked that way.....)

Is this machine part of the domain already? To check, if you right–click My Computer, Properties, Computer Name tab, Change. If it said "Member of Domain", then the machine is already in the domain and no need to run the ConnectComputer wizard.

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when I run server/connectcomputer/ I get a warning that the computer was already part of the domain if you want to save the users settings you must migrate these profiles before completing this wizard; you will not be able to migrate them later. For information about how to migrate domain profiles see Windows Small Business Server 2003 documentation at the MS web site.(or something like that)....
