How do I direct the client Windows Update Utility to point to the Server? Or is it always going to point to MS?

> *The GP changes can take up to three workstation reboots to hit. However, links to WU are always going to point to the Microsoft Windows Update site.*

> *Your SUS-applied updates will happen according to the settings in your GP.*

> *You'll be able to see the settings from the GP in Automatic Updates on the*

> *workstations, but you won't have the option to change them even with admin*

> *rights. And, you'll be able to verify what's going on by viewing the file*

> *c:\windows\Windows Update.log on the workstations – you'll see that it's*

> *looking for updates on your SUS server rather than WU.*

> *You can run Windows Update from the workstation to make yourself comfortable*

> *that SUS is working (although the Baseline Security Analyzer is a better way*

> *to do this IMO), or to immediately get an urgent update or something that's*

> *not included in SUS.*
