Not sure what steps you took for uninstall intranet. Here are the steps from other thread for your reference. What kind of error while you access owa and oma?

>Uninstall the intranet component

>1. Click Start, click Control Panel, and then click Add or

>Remove Programs.

>2. Select Windows Small Business Server 2003 and then

>click Change/Remove.

>The Setup Wizard appears.

>3. Click Next to start the wizard.

>4. On the Windows Configuration page, click Next.

>5. On the Component Selection page, in the Action column,

>change Server

>Tools to Maintenance, change Intranet component to Remove,

>and then click

>Next.

>6. On the Component Summary page, click Next.

>7. Click Finish.

>Uninstall Microsoft SQL Server Desktop Engine (SHAREPOINT)

>In Add or Remove Programs, select Microsoft SQL Server

>Desktop Engine

>(SHAREPOINT) and then click Remove. A dialog box appears.

>To confirm that

>you want to remove, click Yes.
