>and had a thought myself. I checked user permissions on individual client computers, and they were non-existent. There were users and permissions set
>for the client to log onto the work station rather than to the server. I set
>that up, and have had no problems with them using the accounting software.
I
>think the lack of being able to use some of the network shares is not so much
>a problem as we have a lot of people moving files, or creating up to 6 copies
>of a file "on accident." I have yet to implement the user permissions at the
>client stations, but if that doesn't work, I'll be sure to be asking for more
>help. Thanks for your suggestions.

>> >Originally had a server setup w/ SBS2003 and had no problems switching
>> users
>> >from power users to Administrators. All users had to be power users in
>> order
>> >to input their time to our accounting software. Had a shock to the
server
>> >which fried the motherboard. We then had to reinstall the OS and
>> configure
>> >the drives to run on the new RAID controller. Now when I set users to
be
>> >power users, they cannot access network shared folders or the
accounting
>> >software. I am changing user permissions in the Server Management
console
>> >under users and the "change user permissions" wizard. THE only way to
>> allow
>> >users to access the network shares or do anything is to give them
>> >administrative privileges. This has turned the once clean setup we had
>> into
>> >a zoo and I need to know how to make the Power User permissions work.
