

RE: Installing root certificate on PDA

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Hi Steve,

Glad to hear from you.

As your description, I understand that you want to install a root certificate in order to allow synchronization with SBS via internet. If I am off base, please let me know.

Based on my research, you can follow the steps below:

1. When running the CEICW, ensure to check the OMA (Outlook Mobile Access) option in the "Web Services Configuration" page, this will configure the System to allow OMA and "Server ActiveSync" access from the Internet. Note that if you installed ISA on the SBS 2K3, please do run the CEICW again to re-allow OMA.
2. The client host machine must be configured using the SBS Set Up Computer Wizard. During the Set Up Computer Wizard, the option to install ActiveSync 3.7 must be configured as well. If this is pushed to the client machine, then there will be an option in the Start Menu called Mobile Device Configuration. Then, run Mobile Device Configuration and it should be able to provision your phone or PPC (including installing the certificate) so that the Server ActiveSync works.
