Yes I agree it has gone Wild. We ran BOSBS for years and have not had any problems.

I have been trying to get this up and running for Tuesday AM so I am a little stressed out. Thank you again for all your help.

From a cold( power off) F8 will start up the DSRM, give a grey screen, run chkdsk, then goes to the black screen with safe mode in upper left corner and then displays the now infamous lasse.exe message and then reboots.I never gets to a desktop. I never have an opportunity to "correct my errors. I believe if I can ever get to opens services I can indentify those which I changed. My notes are sketchy.

I agree its probably conincendital, with the other post but it was nice to know I am not the only one who has ever seen this type of error. I had installed Symnatec Client Security 3.0 earlier Friday and did not seem to have any problems except the constant alerts as it set up permissions for each program.

- > returning the status of services to normal. Sounds like it did a chkdsk and
- > rebooted, if so the idea would have been to again try for DSRM, get to a
- > desktop to change the NIC settings.

>> in all startup modes, including Safe Mode, Safe Mode with Networking, Safe  
>> Mode with Command Prompt, Directory Services Restore Mode. Therefore, you  
>> are not able to start the server or restore the system state from backup.

>> I'm afraid that at this point, the best way to restore the server is:  
>> Perform a server reinstallation and restore all information from the  
>> backup

>> copy of SBS 2003, it does prevent you from starting Recovery Console. For

>> 3. Catalog the backup tape that contains the most recent system state  
>> backup.  
>>  
>> 4. Restore the system state to an alternate location.  
>>  
>> 5. Copy the registry hives from the restored system state to the  
>> %windir%\System32\Config folder of the original installation. If you are  
>> using Ntbackup.exe on Windows Server 2003, the registry hives will be in a  
>> folder named Registry in the location where you restored the system state.  
>>
