> damaged in situations where the computer is shut down incorrectly. To

> resolve this issue, perform the steps below:

> 1. Click "Start", and then click "Run".

>

> 2. In the "Open" box, type the following line, and then press ENTER:

>

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> esentutil /p %windir%\security\database\secedit.sdb
>
> 3. Click "Start", and then click "Run".
>
> 4. In the "Open" box, type the following line, and then press ENTER:
>
> %windir%\security
>
> 5. Right-click the "Edb.log" file and the "Edb0000<x>.log" file, and then
> click "Delete".
>
> 6. Click "OK" when you are prompted to confirm the deletion.
>
> Note When you perform this procedure, some data loss may result. For
> example, cached local security policy settings may be lost.
>
