- > permission level to General Documents in Companyweb site. If I am off
- > base,
- > please don't hesitate to let me know.

- > WSS provides the ability to control permissions on a per-list basis, so
- > you
- > can not set different access permission to files or folders included in
- > General Documents library. If you have sensitive information stored in a
- > list, and you do not want to expose the information to all members of your
- > site, you can set permissions for just that list to control which users
- > can
- > view, edit, or add items to that list.
- >
- > You can grant permissions to a list or document library to individual
- > users, to groups of users, or to a site group. Per-list permissions work
- > for any list or document library in a Web site based on Windows SharePoint
- > Services (for example, Announcements, Tasks, Shared Documents, and so on).
- >
- > List permissions can be changed by any user who has the Manage List
- > Permissions right (by default, included in the Administrator site group)
- > or
- > Full Control permissions for that list. By default, all members of a Web
- > site (all users assigned to a site group, except for the Guest site group)

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- > have access to all lists and document libraries on that Web site. Each
- > site
- > group has a predefined level of permissions for all lists and document
- > libraries.
- >
- > When you grant a user or group permissions to a specific list in your
- > site,
- > they are added to the Guest site group if they are not already members of
- > the site. Note that members of the Guest site group cannot navigate to a
- > page within the site unless you give them the exact page URL.
- >
