Based on my knowledge, this Content.ie5 folder is a system folder that is used by Windows and is not typically visible in My Computer or Windows Explorer. That is a normal behavior. That means if we access the folder C:\Documents and Settings\administrator\local settings\temporary internet files\

We will not see the Content.ie5 folder. However, we can access the folder by run

"C:\Documents and Settings\administrator\local settings\temporary internet files\Content.ie5"
