You have to remove it manually after install it on clients. So in that way you will receive no notification for SP2 after this.

| Thanks for your reply. However, as I've indicated, I've had bad experiences
| trying to install XP SP2 on older machines. It invariably "breaks" the
| operating system, necessitating a complete, clean reinstall. I see no
| benefits from XP SP2, as it is primarily designed to secure a home-based
| PC,

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| not protected by a separate industrial grade firewall.

| I would like to stop SBS trying to install this software, if at all
| possible. I have plans to progressively install the software anyway,
| manually when I can be sure that the system(s) concerned have been backed
up
| and they can be taken out of the production environment to have the time
| required spent on it. With MS forcing this upgrade upon my network, I
can be
| assured of neither. At the moment, I can only advise my users to refuse
any
| installs undertaken by the SBS system and this does not inspire
confidence in
| either me or the OS.
