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Thanks Andrew for the quick reply -- have read your reply a few times, but I'm still confused on some issues -- see below.

Simple things such as definitions such as "local" and "remote" machine. Is "local" the machine I sit in front of at the time (could be my home or office PC) or is "local" always the PC connected by LAN cable to the SBS server?

"Andrew" wrote:

- > Option 2
- > You need to adjust the settings of the local machine.

Which one is the local machine? The one in the office attached by LAN cable to the server or the one in my home connecting to the SBS LAN via dial-up?

- > Try making the
- > address of your rww as part of your intranet or a trusted site in the IE
- > internet settingsn for the quickest way to do it.

Sorry, don't understand any of this -- what is the "address of my rww"? And do you mean making the address of my SBS server (myname.dyndns.org) a trusted site in the IE6 security settings of the home PC?

- > It takes a while for the active x to come down.

Guess this ActiveX is some stuff that gets downloaded the 1st time from the office, direct connected PC to the modem connected home PC, or is that something that comes from the microsoft.com download site?

- > If you are on slow dial up you need to wait a good
- > minute or what seems an error may just be that you are being too impatient
- > for the Active X to download.

Did not take very long for the error message to appear, maybe 20 seconds and after that nothing more happens.

..... Guess what I'm looking for are some .doc file or clear instructions that show me (a RWW newby) how to get "Opt 2 - Connect to my computer at

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work" to work

>> Just a bit of background on my system: I have a small network SBS2003
>> Standard Ed. (SP1 installed) there is a server with 2 NIC's, an old
> Netgear
>> RO318 router on the outside NIC and a Netgear switch between the server
> and
>> the PC's. I am connected to the internet via broadband cable, the ISP
> does
>> not support static IP's so I signed up with dyndns.org and got a name for
> the
>> system, myname.dyndns.org. On the router ports 25, 443, 44 and 4125 are
>> forwarded to the external NIC on the server. There are currently 4
>> workstations, all running XP Pro SP2 and Office 2003. All users are
>> configured as Mobile Users. Basically all has been running fine for a
> couple
>> of month now.
>>
>> Want to get RWW to work with this system, so I built a 5th PC also running
>> XP SP2, and connected it to the LAN as 5th user. Tested it, works fine.
> Then
>> I disconnected the 5th PC from the LAN, installed a modem and got a
> pre-paid
>> dialup account for testing. Browsing using IE6 works fine. Can also log-in
> to
>> RWW – so far – so good.

>> . Opt 1 – Can read my company e-mail – pretty slow, but works fine
>> . Opt 2 – Connect to my computer at work — got a problem here: Error
>> message: This portion of the Remote Web Workplace requires the Microsoft
>> Remote Desktop Active X Control. Your browsers security settings may be
>> preventing you from downloading Active X controls. Adjust these settings
> and
>> try to connect again.
>> . Opt 3 – Use my company's internal web site – very slow, but also works
> fine.

>> How can I get Option 2 to work? I'm a bit confused here, need the security
>> settings on the local PC or the remote PC be adjusted, or on both? And
> what

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>> needs to be set/installed to get this to work?
>>
>> Also lets say I want log in as Larry into RWW, for option 2 to work does
>> Larry's local PC have to be turned on, but logged out? – or does that also
>> work if Larry's PC is in any other state, say not turned on, or turned on
> but
>> in standby mode?
>>
>> Thanks in advance for any assistance.
