>> Based on my research, by default, non-delivery reports (NDRs) are enabled

>> on the Exchange 2000/2003 Server. You can disable them by using Exchange

>> System Manager. You can also specify who can receive copies of NDRs.

>> To disable NDRs, follow these steps:

>> 1. Click Start, point to Programs, point to Microsoft Exchange, and

>> click System Manager.

>> 2. Expand the Global Settings container in the left pane, click Internet

>> Message Formats, right-click the Default object, and then click Properties.

>> 3. Click the Advanced tab.

>> 4. Click to clear the Allow non-delivery reports check box, and then click

>> OK.

>> To specify who can receive copies of NDRs, follow these steps:

>>

>> 1. Under Administrative Groups, expand First Administrative Group, expand

>> Servers, expand servername, expand Protocols, expand SMTP, and then open the Default SMTP Virtual Server properties.

>> 2. Click the Messages tab, and then add an address to the Send copy of non-delivery report to field.

>> 3. Stop, and then restart the MS Exchange Routing Engine and SMTP services.

>>

>> Microsoft recommends that you also create a postmaster e-mail address for

>> NDRs that come from other servers. This can be a secondary SMTP address for

>> a user or a mail-enabled User account. Use Active Directory Users and

>> Computers to add the e-mail address or mail-enabled account.

>>

>> The user will not receive the actual message that caused the NDR.

However,

>> if the notice is opened and Send Again is selected, the actual message

>> appears and can be forwarded if you want.
