>> Thanks for your prompt reply.
>>
>> Regarding your further question, I would like to provide some
information
>> for you. However, it's better to post it separately. The reason why we
>> ask is so that we can better track the correct number of issues and to
>> insure that we can deliver a timely resolution for each issue.
Meanwhile,
>> we can concentrate fully on each of these problems we ask that you post
>> them as separate threads. Your understanding on this will be greatly
>> appreciated!
>>
>> The Monitoring database and SharePoint database are using the MSDE, the
>> Exchange database and log files are not using the MSDE, the database
>> belongs to the Exchange itself. We can upgrade the instance SharePoint
to
>> SQL and it is not recommended that upgrade SBSMONITORING to SQL as the
code
>> for the SBS Monitoring is all for pulling the information from the MSDE
>> instance. Additionally, it is not supported to upgrade the instance of

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>> MSDE installed for Monitoring (SBSMONITORING) and it is really not needed
>> to upgrade SBSMONITORING.
>>
>> You can follow the instructions are outlined in Premiuminstallsteps.htm on
>> the root of the Premium CD to upgrade the instance SHAREPOINT to SQL and it
>> is no need to manually migrate data from MSDE to SQL server and all data is
>> kept.
>>
>> Before you do the upgrade process, I suggest you backup your Companyweb
>> data firstly in case any unexpected things happen. You can refer to the
>> following KB article to backup:

>> To upgrade the instance of Microsoft SQL Server Desktop Engine (Windows)
>> (WMSDE) that is used for Windows SharePoint Services, follow these steps:
>>
>> 1. Insert the Microsoft Windows Small Business Server 2003 Premium
>> Technologies installation CD-ROM in your computer's CD-ROM or DVD-ROM
>> drive. The Autostart option may start the Microsoft Windows Small Business
Server 2003 Premium Technologies Setup wizard. If the wizard does not
>> start, click Start, click Run, locate the CD-ROM or DVD-ROM drive, and
then
>> click Setup.exe.
>>
>> 2. On the first page of the Microsoft Windows Small Business Server 2003
>> Premium Technologies Setup wizard, click Install Microsoft SQL Server
2000.
>>
>> *Note: If Windows Small Business Server 2003 came preinstalled on your
>> server, your original equipment manufacturer (OEM) may have created a
>> shortcut on the desktop that installs the Premium Technologies.

>> 3. When you receive the SQL Server 2000 SP2 and below message, click
>> Continue. You will install SQL Server 2000 Service Pack 3a later.

>> 4. On the Welcome page, click Next.
>>
>> 5. On the Computer Name page, click Local Computer, and then click Next.

>> 6. On the Installation Selection page, click Upgrade, remove, or add
>> components to an existing instance of SQL Server, and then click Next.

>> 7. If this is the first instance of SQL Server 2000 to be installed on
>> Windows Small Business Server 2003, the CD–Key page will open. On the
>> CD–Key page, type your Windows Small Business Server 2003 product key in
>> the space that is provided, and then click Next. The product key is
found
>> on the back of the Windows Small Business Server 2003 CD–ROM case.
>>
>> *Note: If Windows Small Business Server 2003 came preinstalled on your
>> server, the product key is located on the Certificate of Authenticity
>> (COA). The COA is a multicolored label that is located on the side or
the
>> top of your computer.

>> 8. On the Instance Name page, click to clear the Default check box. In
the
>> Instance name list, click SHAREPOINT, and then click Next.
>>
>> *Important: Do not upgrade the instance of WMSDE installed for
Monitoring
>> (SBSMONITORING). Windows Small Business Server 2003 does not support
this
>> instance.
>>
>> 9. On the Existing Installation page, click Upgrade your existing
>> installation, and then click Next.
>>
>> 10. On the Upgrade page, click to select the Yes, upgrade my programs
check
>> box, and then click Next.
>>
>> 11. When you receive the Do you want to install additional components
>> message, click Yes.
>>
>> 12. If this is the first instance of SQL Server 2000 to be installed on
>> Windows Small Business Server 2003, in the Components list, click to
select
>> the Management Tools check box and the Books Online check box.
>>
>> 13. On the Select Components page, under Subcomponents, click to select
the
>> Full–Text Search check box, and then click Next.
>>
>> 14. On the Start Copying Files page, click Next.
>>
>> 15. On the Setup Complete page, click Finish.
>>
>> After you upgrade successfully, check the instance version. If it is not
>> SP4, you need apply SP4 to the instance using SBS 2003 SP1 CD.

>> >> Based on my research, this error message is usually caused by the
>> incorrect
>> >> sharing and security permissions of the Users Shared Folders. Since
>> this
>> >> issue still occurs after you have verified the permissions of this
>> folder,
>> >> I would suggest we reinstall the SBS components to recreate the Users
>> >> Shared Folders and then perform the proper steps to move the folder
to
>> >> other disk partition. To reinstall the components, refer to the
>> following
>> >> steps:
>> >>

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>> >> 1. Remove the share of the current Users Shared Folders (That's to say,
>> do
>> >> not share this folder).
>> >>
>> >> 2. Open "Add/Remove Programs" in "Control Panel", select "Windows Small
Small
>> >> Business Server 2003", click "Change/Remove".
>> >>
>> >> 3. In the wizard, click "Next" button, when the wizard asks you to
>> choose
>> >> the components, select "Maintenance" for "Server tools", select
>> "Reinstall"
>> >> for "Administration" and "Client Deployment".
>> >>
>> >> 4. Click "Next" button to finish the reinstallation.
>> >>
>> >> After the above steps, you will see "Users shared folders" on C:
drive
>> >> again. And then you may follow the steps in the "Moving Data Folders
>> for
>> >> Windows Small Business Server 2003" document and use Xcopy command to
>> move
>> >> the folder to another drive. By using the Xcopy command to move the
>> >> folder, the security permissions of the folder will not be changed.
