- > so the problem you encountered should be a pure client issue, I suggest you
- > refer to the steps below to see how to configure a POP3 account on the
- > outlook 2003.

> 4. Click "POP3", and then click "Next".

> 5. Enter your e-mail account information.

> 6. In the Your Name box, type your name as you would like it to appear.

> 7. In the "E-mail Address" box, type your Yahoo! e-mail address, for  
> example, user@xxxxxxxxxx

>

> 8. In the "Incoming mail server (POP3)" box, type "pop.mail.yahoo.com"  
> (without the quotation marks).

> 9. In the "Outgoing mail server (SMTP)" box, type "smtp.mail.yahoo.com"  
> (without the quotation marks).

- > 10. In the User Name box, verify that everything before the at symbol (@)
- > symbol of your Yahoo! e-mail address is displayed.

- > 11. Enter your Yahoo! password.

- > IMPORTANT: The Yahoo! Mail SMTP server now requires authentication. To this
- > setting on, follow these steps:

- > 1. From the Tools menu, click Accounts.

- > 3. Click your Yahoo! Mail account, and then click Properties.

- > How to Control Deletion of Messages from the Yahoo! Mail Server

- > 1. In the properties of the Internet E-mail settings, click the "More
- > Settings" button.

- > 2. Click the Advanced tab.

- > 3. Click to select the "Leave a copy of messages on the server" check
- > box if you want to save your Yahoo! Mail messages on the Yahoo! Mail
- > server as well as on your local computer. If you want your messages to
- > be deleted from the Yahoo! Mail server once you have received them, do
- > not check select this option.

- > For the POP3 connectors, you might need to configure on the server side and
- > the email will be route your existing exchange mailbox, you do not need to

> |> Basically, I still seem to be unable to configure pop3 connectors on  
> SBS2003.  
> |>  
> |> I have a test home network, which I obviously use for work. At home, I  
> have  
> |> created a yahoo email address i.e. username@xxxxxxxxxxxx  
> |>  
> |> I have an SBS2003 server and 3 workstations. An ADSL router with port  
> |> forwarding to the server. I have internet access and all else appears  
> ok  
> |> after running appropriate tests. No errors in event log.  
> |>  
> |> In SBS2003 in Exchange, I have configured the pop3 connector as follows:  
> |>  
> |> Email server: pop.mail.yahoo.com  
> |> Port: 110  
> |> Username: yahoo username  
> |> Password: yahoo password  
> |>  
> |> Mailbox type: User Mailbox  
> |> Exchange mailbox: Administrator  
> |>  
> |> Yet, when I log onto a workstation as administrator and setup Outlook,  
> then  
> |> run the email test, a window appears which keeps asking for the  
> username and  
> |> password. I have input my yahoo username and password numerous times.  
> The  
> |> username and password it requires is obviously my email username and  
> password.  
> |>  
> |> I then try logging into yahoo with the same details and it works fine.  
> Is  
> |> there anything I am missing?
