- > 2004' and click 'Change/Remove'. Select to Remove the ISA components.

- > 2. Refer to the following KB article. Make sure that the files mentioned

- > the KB have been removed:
- > 884494 You receive a "Setup failed while registering Wspadmin.dll" error

- > 3. Open "services.msc" (without quotation marks) console. Ensure that the
- > MSDE instance for ISA 2004 logging has been removed (MSSQL\$MSFW)
- >
- > 4. Remove the folder C:\Program Files\Microsoft SQL Server.

- > 5. Open regedit. Remove the following registry:
- >
- > HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Microsoft SQL Server\MSFW
- >
- > 6. Reboot the server.
- >
- > 7. Reinstall the ISA 2004 components from the SBS 2003 SP1 CD.
- >
- > 2> Will ISA 2004 revert to it's original state.

- > Yes, running CEICW will recreate all the rules except those rules you
- > created by yourself.
- >
- > 1. Open ISA Management, delete all of the existing Web publishing rules
- > except the default rule, delete the existing Small Business Internet
- > Access
- > Protocol Rule, the Small Business Server Internet Access Site and Content
- > Rule, and the Small Business Server All Users Site and Content Rule. Close
- > ISA Management.

- > 2. Re-run the CEICW:

- > A. Click Start on your SBS server, click Server Management.
- > B. Click To Do List and then click "Connect to the Internet".
- > C. Click Next, select connection type and click Next.
- > D. Select Enable firewall and click Next.
- > E. Follow the instructions to finish the wizard.
