Very odd. Have you tried configuring the 3 components seperately via the CEICW? Have you applied ISA 2004 SP2 (shot in the dark here!)? In the C:\Program Files\Microsoft Windows Small Business Server\Networking\ICW folder there will be a load of icwdetails\*.htm files. These contain the configuration settings you have specified when running the CEICW. Do they look OK? In the C:\Program Files\Microsoft Windows Small Business Server\Support folder is the icwlog files. Any obvious errors in there?  
Have

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you tried a Windows Update to update your NIC drivers (another shot in the dark here!!)?

Everytime I've had a problem with the CEICW wizard it's been down to DHCP

or

DNS. Clear your event logs and reboot; any errors?

As a side note, I concur with Jeff that this is nothing to do with the Swing Migration.
