3. For your information if you want to configure Read Only Permission for :

- Open Server Management\Distribution Groups.
- On the right pane, click Add a Distribution Group and run the Add Distribution Group Wizard.
- Finish the wizard.
- Right click the Shared Folders you want to configure the permissions, and select Properties.
- On the Sharing tab, click Permissions.
- Add the Distribution Group in and only assign Read permission.
- On the Security tab, also add this Distribution Group in and assign Read permission.
- Click OK.
