Based on my research, I suggest you try the following steps to narrow down this problem:

1. Please refer to the following KB for detailed steps to reset secure channel and let me know the result:

2. Please use the Nslookup.exe command line tool to verify the A records and the PTR records related to CLISBS.CLILANG.LOCAL and its IP address, to do so:

3. Please search the domain and see if there are any other duplicate names that may cause the issue. To do so, run the command `ldifde -f c:\export.txt -t 3268 -d "DC= CLILANG, DC=LOCAL"`. Compress the c:\export.txt file and send it to me at v-stezhu@xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx
