I understand that you fail to install the SBS 2K3 SP1. In this case, please help me to gather following information to analysis your issue:

1. Please go to %system drive%\program files\Microsoft Integration\windows small business server 2003\logs. Zip the Logs fold and send it as an attachment to my mailbox (v-branee@xxxxxxxxxxxxxx).
2. Zip the C:\Windows\KB885918.log to me.
3. Please explain in detail "a network share name 'clients'. I change it for 'Family'". May I know what exact "clients" it is? Do you mean the "clients" shared folder on the SBS Server (C:\Program Files\Microsoft Windows Small Business Server\ClientSetup\Clients)? If yes, how did you change the name? "Clients" is the built in shared folder and we do not suggest rename it.

Domain Users – Read & Execute <Not inherited> Apply to "This folder,
