>> Connection Manager or Activesync to my machine on the the SBS domain. I have
>> manually installed Activesync 4.2 onto my laptop, however, when I ran
>> activesync 4.2 and tried to sync I received a certificate error message "The
>> Security Certificate on the server is invalid" With support code 80072f0d.
