|> Based on my experience, on SBS server, there are already 2 instances using
|> MSDE to store SharePoint (Companyweb) uses the MSSQL\$SharePoint database,
|> while the Monitoring features use the MSSQL\$SBSMonitoring database to store
|> data. Both of these features are mutually exclusive for the most part.
|>
|> If you are using SQL 2000, you could (and you should) upgrade the
|> SharePoint named instance to full SQL.
|> Note : You cannot upgrade the Monitoring instance to SQL
|> The steps are listed in the premiuminstallsteps.htm on the root of the
|> Premium CD. (I will send you this file in a separated email) After SQL
|> installation, you should only have the following 2 items in
|> "Add/Remove
|> Programs":
