I need the instructions on how to create a server to server vpn. Both servers are running sbs2003 premium, they have different domain names. Both have the same ip address range (for example 192.0.0.xxx).

Do they have to have different ip address ranges (for example 192.0.0.xxx and 192.1.0.xxx) or can they both be the same? I've managed to create a vpn using the wizard, but I cannot view files/folders on the remote server.

Yes, that is the answer. SBS has a wizard to change IP addresses, which sorts out DHCP at the same time.

It is recommended to use high 192.168. networks, as the 0, 1 and 16 are in common use. The 192.168.0.0 and 192.168.1.0 networks are used as a default by many DSL routers, and few people change them. Anyone using VPN from a home network with ICS in use has no choice but to use the Microsoft fixed address of 192.168.0.0.
