Like I said there might be two un-related

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issues?

1st – Users have full rights to a network file and can no longer make changes to it. Nothing has been changed on the administration side.

Nothing has changed and you verified the share security and NTFS folder permissions? What happens when they type in the RUN menu
\\servername\sharename?

2nd – Some users are getting this proxy box, occasionally. Sometimes it goes away sometimes they have to keep hitting okay to make it go away.

Compare internet LAN settings with two different workstations. Some may be checked to bypass proxy server for local addresses.
