Nothing has changed and you verified the  
share security and NTFS

permissions? What happens when they type  
in the RUN menu  
\\servername\sharename?

2nd – Some users are  
getting this proxy box,  
occasionally.  
Sometimes  
it  
goes away sometimes they  
have to keep hitting okay to  
make it go  
away.

Compare internet LAN settings with two  
different workstations. Some  
may  
be  
checked to bypass proxy server for local  
addresses.
