Hi all,

I've setup Exchange on our SBS but it's
unable to send our emails. Instead
we just get an automated email after a few
hours saying that the email was
delayed... but it never arrives.

We don't use DNS but instead all of the mail
is forwarded to our ISP's SMTP
host. The outgoing server requires
authentication but I think I've set this
up correctly (using the Outbound Security
window in SMTP connector properties

advanced).

I have no idea what's wrong as Exchange
checks our POP3 accounts just fine
and we can send mail using standard
Outlook setup as well.

Help appreciated.
