Hello DT,

Thank you for kind update.

Based on my test, when the clients want to access the block web sites, they will be prompt to input Content Advisor password, If they can provide correct password, they still can access the web site. If you do not want they are prompted to input password, please:

- a. IE->Internet Options->Content tab, click Settings button under Content Advisor panel
- b. Input correct password, click OK
- c. Select General tab, uncheck Supervisor can type a password to allow users to view restricted content option. Click OK twice.

Then, the users will not be prompted to input password when the clients want to access the block web site.

Meanwhile, the "Content Advisor" is not the better way to block web sites for whole domain client computers, it is design for single computer at home. I still suggest you upgrade your SBS to premium version, then you can install ISA server 2004 on SBS. The ISA will be easy to block any websites for whole domain network.

Hope the steps help.
