This product is essential CD1 of the SBS 2003 multi-disk set. It's Windows 2003 Standard and does not contain any of the components (Exchange, etc.) of SBS 2003. As Cris said, it's limited to CALs maximum and must be installed as a domain controller holding all 5 FMSO roles. Basically, if you have a small office that needs a domain controller for authentication and file/print serving, the T73-00494 may be fine. However, if you want Exchange, RWW and all the other stuff that comes with SBS 2003, then it's not the right product.

Another case where Ebay hasn't saved you a dime. (sorry, I'm not an Ebay fan – it's like the wild west but with less law and order).

Of course much of the blame I place on Microsoft because they are the ones who gave this software it's name and created the confusion in the first place. (Thanks Microsoft Marketing).
