I recently upgraded 5 workstations running W2k to XP Pro. All are connected to a 2003 server. Since the upgrade 2 of the 5 PC's are subject to the following issue. They drop their connection to the server after several hours off no activity. This is usually over night and requires a restart or re-login the following morning. 4 of the 5 PC's are identical in hardware specs so I can't see it being a hardware issue and besides they all worked fine prior to upgrading to XP. I have disable the power save feature that can turn off the NIC to save power.

Should I be using the net use /persistant command to map the shares? I haven't done this on any of the PC's and 3 of the 5 stay connected without any issues.

Any assistance would be greatly appreciated

you can prevent it by

1. Make sure your clients log off every night (as it should be).

is

Net config server /autodisconnect:-1

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live, or leave & let live.

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
