I had this idea in mind, but I do not implement it because it is quite difficult to set it up. Registry has to be manually changed, so the setup is not straight forward. Have you implemented it ? If so, I suppose you had a lot of work to have it run.

I prefer to stick to the old style: former versions of Exchange could be accessed remotely only by VPN, and this is what I wanted, but separating this traffic from logon traffic.

I use SBS 2003 on a server as primary domain controller in the main office, and I have a Win2003 Server running in our branch 5 miles away. This is no a backup domain controller. Users at the branch connect to the domain in the office via VPN which has been implemented with 2 Linksys routers RV042. What I would like to do is to separate the logon process
