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Is your office system using the same dns numbers the SBS is using? Can they ping that web site and do they get the same ip you get when you ping the web site?

I have a client that is using SBS 2003 Standard, so there is no ISA or Proxy Server. They are having problems connecting to a specific government web site. None of the Machines within the Domain nor the SBS 2003 Server can connect to [www.wsgc.wa.gov](http://www.wsgc.wa.gov). However, I am able to connect from my office system and when they called wa.gov tech support, everyone else is able to connect. I was under the assumption that unless ISA or Proxy was installed on the Server, that there was no way to block specific sites. Please advise as to what the problem might be.
