Hmmm, I'd guess NO".

I was not complaining, just attempting to 'help' you by pointing out aspects of your posting habits that are likely to reduce the likelihood of finding what you are looking for.

As I tried to explain, asking basically the same question multiple times without giving anyone time to answer is not a good strategy here.

Anyway, I think I have a *general* idea of what you want, and might have asked some further questions of you to make sure I understood the scope of what you want, had it not been for the confusion that resulted in my mind from the multiplicity of posts.

> *It is not that complicated if you know scripting I dont know scripting I guess thats why I am in this forum.*

If you say you do not know scripting, then how can you say that solving your problem with a script is not that complicated? I know scripting (some, anyway) and I would not even attempt this without first knowing exactly what is required. And since you are unaware of scripting, you do not realize that you are perhaps not filling in enough of the blanks for those of us that do.

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- > *I asked 5 times 5 different*
- > *ways hoping someone would get what I am asking for.*

I had suggested to you that asking so many times is, in itself, no guarantee to get the answer – in fact, just the opposite. Asking virutally the same question twice five minutes apart – were you really expecting to get an answer to the first before posting the second?

- > *I dont see whats so hard*
- > *to understand.*

Just like I don't see what's so hard to understand about what I said in my previous post.

- > *Just like when you go to a website and it shows you the remote*
- > *ip connected to the site well I want that to run on my servers desktop*
- > *showing the remote ip of the computers connected to exchange or ftp or*
- > *remotly connected to my server. I just want the ip address of every*
- computer*
- > *that access either my exchange site ftp site and display on desktop.*

The solution you seek will be different depending on whether or not you site is on the internet or just an intranet. Also, if on the internet, you will never see the IP address of my computer at home because I am using a firewall and router configuration that prevents this. You might get the IP of my router, but you will now know which of my computers happens to be the one I am using at the time.

If this is a homework assignment, a whole bunch of other issues come to the fore...

- > *I am the type of person*
- > *to help anyone. I wish someone would help me if they know the script.*

Believe it or not, I like to help too. And, if I knew the specific solution, I would give it to you.

We have exchange servers in our network. When we logon to the e-mail system, the exchange server keeps track of this, but I do not know if it logs the IP address. I can also connect interactively to a share on that server, but, as far as I know, and since no "logon script" processing is involved, I am not aware of where the IP address information could be found for such sessions.
